eight syndicated by Spicer Thoroughbreds.

"It's a very strong, physical colt that looks to be an early two-year-old sprinter," Brad said.

Tale of the Cat, was champion first-season sire in New Zealand. He is the sire of horses that have won \$17.1m in stake money and has 26 individual

stakes winners. The colt comes from the famous Cambridge Stud.

"A lot of champions have come from that stud," Brad said.

"All the good judges seem to be supporting Tale of the Cat, with the master himself, Bart Cummings, paying a quarter of a million dollars to secure a colt by that stallion."

Mick Price has an impressive training record. He is third on the Victorian trainers' premiership with 82 wins.

"Most people who buy shares in a racehorse do so for the social side and the thrill of owning a horse," Brad said.

"Spicer Thoroughbreds gives weekly email updates on the colt's progress, plus we operate social outings along with stud and winery tours for all Spicer Thoroughbred clients.
